Community Reminders:

DOG POOP: Please note that all residents are responsible for picking up after their pets. Please help us in keeping the community clean by remembering to bring a doggie bag and picking up after your animals' excrement's.

DON'T LEAVE CHILDREN UNATTENDED: Management has received many complaints regarding parents not being present while their children are swimming in the Jacuzzi and pool areas. If your child is under the age of 14 years, parents must be there with them at all times. If a child is seen without parents, the child will be asked to leave the pool area and contact parents immediately. Additionally, if a child is 6 years or younger, a parent must be within arms reach. Children 6 years and younger have the highest rate of drowning's and it is crucial that a parent pay close attention.

STREET LIGHT OUTAGE: Please note that the Association does not maintain streetlights. If you notice a streetlight that is out, flickering, or damaged you will need to contact Southern California Edison. You can visit their website at www.sce.com or you can use a search engine and type: Southern California light outage and it will direct you to the right place to submit a work order. Make sure you have the pole number ready to submit (located on every streetlight).

STORED VEHICLES: Residents are not allowed to store vehicles within Woodbury Community. Vehicles that appear to be stored with be marked and towed.

KEEP YOUR GARAGES CLEAR: Please keep in mind the garage shall be readily available for parking your vehicles and shall not be used for storage. Please park your vehicles in the garage or your driveway.

STREET SWEEPING DAYS: Street sweeping days are the 2nd and 4th Friday of each month. Please make sure your vehicles are not parked on the street on those days.

POOL MONITORS: Pool monitors will no longer be at any of the pools. The Association will not be providing swim diapers or life jackets so please make sure you provide them for your children. Please be advised that no floatation devices are allowed in the pools. If your child requires floatation aids, please make sure they are U.S. Coast Guard approved such as a life vest or puddle jumper. This is a great way to keep your child safe!

OUR COMMUNITY STREETS – As a reminder to Woodbury residents that most of the streets within the community are public streets and are subject to parking enforcement by the Irvine Police Department. There are numerous signs posted throughout the community that clearly identify the areas designated as FIRE LANES. You will be cited or towed without warning at the owners expense if parked within 15' of a fire hydrant. These laws will also be enforced on the private streets as well. Fair warning!

Winter Pool and Spa Heating Schedule

Please note that the heat to the pools and waders at Peppertree Square, Cypress Square, Promenade Square, Date Palm Square and the Resort Pool at the Recreation Center will be turned off for the winter as of October 31st. The heat is scheduled to be turned back on at the beginning of April 2014 for all these facilities.

The heat for the Lagoon Pool, Competition Pool, and all the spas are schedules to be heated throughout winter.


